**Brief Biography**

Richard Moon is a Professor in the Faculty of Law, University of Windsor. He holds degrees from Trent, Queen's, and Oxford universities. He was called to the Ontario Bar in 1984. He is the author of *The Constitutional Protection of Freedom of Expression* (University of Toronto Press, 2000), editor of *Law and Religious Pluralism in Canada* (UBC Press, 2008) and a contributing editor to *Canadian Constitutional Law* (4th ed.) (Emond Montgomery Press, 2010). In 2008 he wrote a report for the Canadian Human Rights Commission dealing with the legal regulation of hate speech on the Internet. His current research is funded by a standard research grant from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada. He was the President of the Canadian Law and Society Association from 2002-2004. In 2009 he was awarded the University of Windsor Alumni Teaching Award. In 2010-11 he will be a Visiting Professor at Centre for Ethics, University of Toronto.
